



3.4.9 RELIGIONS EDUCATION

JANUARY 2007

Rationale

Religious Education is the foundation of the spiritual life for St. Mary's students. It is the subject that assists in establishing and instilling holy principles in their lives. In a wider sense, it guides in teaching a sense of absolute morals, based on the Holy Bible, and the teachings of the Coptic Orthodox Church.

Aims

- The Religious Education program teaches the message of the Holy Bible
- Endeavours to impart an appreciation of the saints of the Church
- Teaches traditions
- Encourages a knowledge and love of the prayers of the Church

Implementation

- There is a yearly overview, term by term planner, as well as detailed weekly lesson plans for Religious Education. There is also a continuity and flow of topics from Preparatory to Year 12 for any given strand, shown through scope and sequence.
- Students are not grouped, all learning the same material, although early finishers are encouraged to read on or learn a new prayer.
- Planning resources include the Holy Bible, the Synexarion (chronicles of the feasts and biographies of the saints), the Agpia (canonical hours prayer book) and religious books.
- Resources also include videos, audio tapes, DVD's and CDs, bibleactivities.com and other internet sites, etc.
- Lessons are given once per week for Grades Prep to Tow, and twice weekly for Grades Three to Year Nine.
- VCE Text and traditions and ethics from years ten to twelve.
- The department is composed of three teaching members
- Assessment is generally done through oral recitation, observation and written examinations
- Reporting is given to parents through parent-teacher interviews and half and end-of-year reports.
- The College provides an annual budget to purchase resources for this department.

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
